Article 1 Community Relations

- 5 The Governing Board recognizes that the district has the primary respon

- The Board prohibits any form of retaliation against any complainant in the complaint 27
- 28 process. Participation in the complaint process shall not in any way affect the status,
- 29 grades, or work assignments of the complainant.
- 30 The Board encourages the early, informal resolution of complaints at the site level
- 31 whenever possible.
- The Board recognizes that a neutral mediator can often suggest a compromise that is 32
- 33 agreeable to all parties in a dispute. The Superintendent or designee may initiate a
- mediation process before beginning a formal compliance investigation, provided that all 34
- parties to the complaint agree to try resolving their problem in this manner. The 35
- Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the results are consistent with state and 36
- federal laws and regulations. 37
